Facts:

- Doctors *never* prescribe anabolic steroids for muscle building in young, healthy people.
- Abuse of anabolic steroids can have long-term negative effects on the male reproductive system.
- Anabolic steroids trigger agressive behavior which can lead to violence. These outbursts are referred to as "roid rages."



Research indicates that some users might turn to other drugs to alleviate some of the negative effects of anabolic steroids, including insomnia and irritability.

Abuse of steroids, often in an attempt to gain more muscle mass can lead to serious health problems, some of which are irreversible.

How Anabolic Steroids are Used/Abused:

- Pills are taken orally
- Liquid is Injected IM (Intramuscular)

Behavioral Effects of Anabolic Steroids:

Many users report feeling good about themselves while on anabolic steroids, but researchers report that extreme mood swings can also occur, including manic-like symptoms leading to violence. This is because these drugs act in a part of the brain called the limbic system, which influences mood and also involves learning and memory. It can also lead to depression or irritability. Steroids can also result in impaired judgment stemming from feelings of invincibility.

Physical Effects of Anabolic Steroids:

For Boys:


- Shrinking of testicles
- Impotence
- Reduced sperm count
- Infertility
- Baldness
- Development of breasts
- Increased risk for prostate cancer


For Girls:

- Facial hair growth
- Male-pattern baldness
- Changes in or cessation of the menstrual cycle
- Enlargement of the clitoris
- Permanently deepened voice
- Smaller breasts

Steroids are legal by prescription only, to be used to treat specific medical conditions and only safe when used under a physican's supervision.

NIDA (National Institute on Drug Abuse) findings show that in 1998, 68.1% of 12th graders believed that steroids were harmful. In 2005, just seven years later only 56.8% believed that steroids were harmful. Prevention research shows that as perceived risk goes down, use rates go up.
